The annual National Assessment Program testing for Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 takes place from 15-17 May. Students are tested nationally in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

International Composting Awareness Week (7-12 May)


This week draws awareness worldwide to the importance and value of restoring health to our soils and the natural environment.

Get the children into the garden and grow some healthy organic vegetables for winter eating. Many vegetables can be grown in balcony gardens or by easy no-dig gardening.


