It is important that, as parents, we listen carefully to what our children are telling us, especially when they need to talk about the changes in the family.

This will help us to understand where they are coming from.

Many experts agree that it's not the separation itself, but the ongoing conflict that hurts children in the long term.

The way children behave is usually a sign of what they are feeling.

If they are not behaving well, maybe they are hurting but cannot tell you in words.

Major Capital Works Monthly Update

Summary

Throughout July the project architects have been reviewing the feedback from project stakeholders and developing the Schematic Design for the school. The particular focus has been to confirm building layouts and to start looking at preliminary finishes and furniture for the different spaces. This was aided by undertaking detailed site investigations.

The Schematic Design was well received during the presentations to the community late in the month, with valuable feedback from the school staff enabling the room layouts to be refined. Confirming the priorities for the works and refining the design to ensure the proposed spaces are flexible and highly utilised were key outcomes from the various community engagement sessions.

Key Tasks Completed in July 2014

- Detailed site investigations completed during the school holiday period aided the development of the design.
- Further cost planning exercises were undertaken on the Schematic Designs to ensure the project is developing within the allocated budget.
- Schematic Design community engagement sessions held 29th and 30th of July 2014. Sessions included a number of stakeholders including the PCG, AECG, Local Reference Group, local elders, parents, students, and teachers.

Key Tasks to be undertaken in August 2014

- Schematic Design to be presented to DEC Stakeholders.
- Endorsement of the Schematic Design by PCG and DEC Stakeholders to be completed.
- Planning and commencement of the Detailed Design stage.

Sibling photos




